In Japan, the first system for the national qualification of "Licensed Psychologist" in the field of clinical psychology was launched in 2018.

Students are able to take the exam for the national qualification after obtaining the required credits at the undergraduate level and proceeding to the master's program at graduate school, or after gaining at least two years of work experience in clinical practice. For this reason, we have sent many human resources to the fields of health care and medical care.
