[Course aims]

To understand the physical, mental, and psychological characteristics of the elderly, to methodically gain specialized professional knowledge, skills, and attitudes needed to conduct various types of dental treatments for the recovery or enhancement of oral functions in the elderly, and to acquire the ability to perform the above in clinical practice, in order to contribute to the improvement of the quality of life (QOL) of the elderly

[Course objectives]

The goals of this course are for the student to be able to:

1. Understand the mental and physical characteristics of the elderly, and to conduct medical treatment accordingly.
2. Understand the healthcare, medical care, and welfare systems for the elderly, and to conduct medical treatment accordingly.
3. Understand the association between systemic diseases found in the elderly and dental pathologies, and to provide safe and secure medical care.
4. Understand the features of the stomatognathic system in the elderly, and to select suitable treatment for individual cases.
5. Understand the development of language and speech disorders in the elderly, and to provide practical assistance using dental methods
6. Understand eating and swallowing disorders, and to perform oral care correctly.
